
He is not on his own either, we heard plenty

We had some great 'Tree' shots, a few broken arrows across the board but only tears of laughter and delight knowing what a great time it was shooting with their mates!




Seeing our future generations joining the ranks of winner is amazing. We must continue to encourage, support and help the next champions!





All bow styles were well represented across all age groups with a few extra helpers to supporting our archers with a wag of their tail,


telling us the next shot will be the one and seeing where it went.
