Shoot Results

Cloth of Gold 'Bodnik Style' Shoot 30th June 2024

Cloth Of Gold held its second shoot of 2024 on 30th June, we had an overcast start to the day while booking-in took place but it turned into bright sunshine for the duration of the shoot and our woods looked their best for the 76 archers taking part.

Most of the shoots we organise follow the standard NFAS format and 'Big Game' scoring but we've been putting on a 'Bodnik style shoot' in the summer for the last three years. This takes its format from the 'Bodnik Bowhunter Challenge' which has been taking place in Europe for the last 10 years. It aims to recreate actual bowhunting situations and scenes. When hunting with traditional bows shots further than 30 yards should not be taken, so to keep it lifelike and challenging all the distances shot are set up in realistic settings within normal distances for bowhunting. In addition, the shoot rewards 'kills' while penalising 'wounds' on the target.

The 'Bodnik Bowhunter Challenge' only allows traditional wooden bows and arrows but to permit as many bow styles to take part and to keep within NFAS shooting rules, our shoot was open to all shooting styles with the exception of Compound bows, crossbows and sighted bows purely for the purposes of target protection, due the shorter distances involved and the large number of smaller targets in use.

We used three shooting classes in place of the usual 13 shooting styles we are presently accustomed to. These were, Class 1 – wooden arrows shot off the hand. Class 2 – wooden arrows shot off the shelf. Class 3 – Aluminium or carbon arrows shot off the hand or shelf.

To reduce the numbers of archers shooting on individual pegs we set a course of 2x25, 3D targets. The course was shot in one circuit of the full course shooting two arrows off the first (Red) peg with both arrows scoring 10 points for a kill and minus 2 points for a wound. Then after a break archers made their second circuit of the course shooting one arrow from the second (yellow) peg with the scoring 20 points for a 'kill' and minus 5 points for a 'wound'.

This gave a maximum possible score of 1000 points but a minimum possible score of minus 225 points – best avoided. Misses were 0 points.

In addition to the short-range shots and generous scoring we also had our world-famous catering tent in action to refresh and refuel archers through the day and we had a bring-and-buy table provided for everyone to browse in passing which did a brisk trade in archery spares, bow bags and various accessories as well as some very nice bows put up for sale by club members and visitors.

At the end of the day, we were able to close the shoot at around 4.30pm and finish the day with 'Bowhunter challenge' medal awards for the winners and runners-up in all three classes taking part.

Again, we had nothing but positive comments on the shoot: "Your best course yet", "some really tricky shots there", "As always, very good", "worth coming just for the catering", "another fantastic day out", "brilliant day, brilliant course and brilliant company".

Thanks to all who helped with course setting, marshalling and running the catering, and to everyone who came and shot round on the day.

We'll hope to have you back again for an NFAS Open Shoot and our final shoot of the year on 29 September.
